

Royal Djurgården Events Policy

OUTLOOK

Here at Royal Djurgården, we have a responsibility to work together for the sustainable development of Djurgården. Through the Royal Djurgården Society, we have come up with a list of criteria for what it means to hold a sustainable event at Djurgården. These criteria seek to minimise the environmental impact, reduce segregation and improve accessibility before, during and after the event. The policy applies to all members of the Royal Djurgården Society.

FIVE CORNERSTONES

1. Events for everyone - an open and welcoming Djurgården

- Work for gender equality and increase diversity among visitors
- Prevent all forms of discrimination and sexual harassment
- Ensure that the venue is accessible to visitors with disabilities
- Clear internal and external communication regarding measures and operations, document work regarding policies and procedures

2. Modern energy supply - Fossil-free Djurgården 2025

- Coordinate transport to and from the event as well as at the event itself
- Use all-electric vehicles or vehicles that use renewable fuels
- Ensure that any standby generators are powered by electricity or renewable fuels
- Encourage the use of public transport
- Promote Djurgården as bike-friendly
- Introduce an idling ban

3. Sustainable food culture

- Prioritise seasonal, local and organic ingredients
- Offer a varied food selection with a large proportion of plant-based ingredients
- Establish procedures to minimise food waste
- Establish waste sorting and a recycling system
- Use reusable items for tableware (or disposable items made from renewable materials)

4. Clean and tidy

- Adjust sound and lighting to reasonable levels
- Manage logistics effectively to prevent crowding, traffic jams and other inconveniences
- Input measures to reduce the amount of packaging and all types of single-use items
- Input measures to minimise the use of plastic
- Ban on confetti and balloon releases

5. Safe and secure

- Health and safety rules must be followed
- An evacuation plan must be in place
- Prevent crowding and promote good hand hygiene
- Ensure a crisis communication plan is in place
- No fireworks for safety reasons and to protect the wildlife
